1.1 Understanding Human Communication

1.4 How Do We Communicate?

- To establish communication we have use our five senses.
 Touch, sight, test, hearing and smell fall under the five communication senses.
- When communicate through five senses, without using voice is known as non-verbal communication.
- To establish communication with the help of voice is known as verbal communication or Oral communication.
- Verbal communication is the use of words to share information with other people. It can therefore include both spoken and written communication.

1.5 Oral Communication

- Oral communication is communicating with spoken words.
- It's a verbal form of communication when you present your thoughts, ideas, and share information.
